The Climate Investment Summit 2020 aims to accelerate private climate investments by showcasing, discussing and determining global best practice in business models, strategies, and enabling policy frameworks.



Introduction

The Climate Investment Summit is a global convening of experienced leaders in green energy and climate investments aiming to mobilise private investments in the energy transition in order to raise the global ambition required for the world to achieve the goals of the Paris Agreement on Climate Change.

The Summit will present leading business models and policy frameworks promoting investments in green energy and climate solutions. It will be held in Denmark, where the Danish pension funds have already invested USD 17 billion towards energy transition and climate mitigation and announced in September 2019, USD 50 billion to be committed towards similar investments by 2030.

The Climate Investment Summit is a key milestone in the Climate Investment Coalition's Roadmap for accelerating climate investments, bringing together key high-level stakeholders to mobilise commitments towards investments from 2020 to 2030.

Objectives

Climate Investment Summit is a unique and leading global forum for the practice of financing and investing in global climate solutions, by taking a starting point in the successes achieved locally, regionally and internationally.

The Climate Investment Summit will:

- Define the promising opportunities for increased global climate investments,
- Present policies, regulatory frameworks and opportunities for public-private collaboration for driving green energy investments in developed and emerging markets,
- Influence the international financial agenda towards COP26 and the coming decade of action,
- Showcase successful business models and financing vehicles for green investments across sectors and geographies,
- Facilitate dynamic networking between asset owners, asset managers, developers, energy companies, governments, project owners, and project developers, financiers and other suitable providers,
- Propose input into the development of a high-level framework for allocating and tracking green investments.





Participants

The Summit will gather leading international stakeholders such as:

- Asset owners, including pension funds, sovereign wealth funds, foundations and other investors,
- Asset managers, including investment banks, infrastructure funds and other financial institutions representing public and private finance,
- Developers, including project developers, energy companies and utilities, and technology providers,
- Government representatives from the state, regional and local level, and their associated bodies,
- International organisations, global initiatives and alliances representing public and private interests.

Programme

The Summit programme will tackle topics from the perspective of institutional investors, public sector regulators and private sector business on investment opportunities in the green energy sector, business models and portfolio construction, financial vehicles for climate investments, de-risking and the required enabling environments for attracting finance.

The Summit's programme focuses on existing and emerging investment areas, including:

- Renewable energy - production and transmission;
- Energy efficiency - buildings and industry;
- Emerging and developing markets;
- Disruptive technologies and innovative solutions
